

### Sports Premium in our School 2025-2026

The Government has given every primary school funding to develop physical education and competitive sport. This funding is intended for the purposes of establishing and developing sports activities which are sustainable in the long term. The school will receive £19,610 of Sports Premium funding for 2025-2026, in our school we are using this funding to provide:

Subscriptions to 'Get Set for PE' platform to assist delivery of lessons, assessment and participation monitoring of children within PE.	£313.50	Regular updates of new lesson plans and schemes of learning allow high quality delivery of PE lessons within a broad curriculum of activities. Monitoring participation will enable PE lead to signpost children to take part in after school sport and/or events.	As staff become more confident and practices established, resources can be re-used.
